**KL2 Career Development Position
for an Assistant Professor
Engaged in Clinical or Translational Research**

The ITS Translational Research Scholars Career Development (ITS Scholars) program engages early-stage investigators in a mentored research experience to support development of their externally funded research program in clinical and/or translational science. Scholars will work with their primary mentor to create an individual development plan outlining their planned educational activities, research projects, funding initiatives, and publications. Scholars will also participate in a series of seminars and workshops for junior faculty members preparing initial grant applications.

We plan to fund one new position for up to 3 years of 75% effort, or until the Scholar secures independent funding. Additional positions may be added based on the availability of funds. We will solicit applications annually to fill vacant or new positions.

Applicants must be members of an existing Multidisciplinary Translational Team (MTT) and should be early-stage investigators with doctoral degrees and full-time UTMB appointments at the level of Assistant Professor. Members of the Translational Research Scholars Program (TRSP) who do not have K12 support are also encouraged to apply. Applicants must also be US citizens or non-citizen nationals, or have been lawfully admitted for permanent residence.

The ITS Scholars Program is funded by the NIH's National Center for Advancing Translational Sciences (KL2TR001441), and is an integral component of UTMB's Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA). The CTSA is a program of the Institute for Translational Sciences, UTMB's home for clinical and translational research.

Mandatory Letter of Intent is due August 4, 2017.
All application materials are due September 1, 2017.
